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Instructions for Intramuscular Injections

Needle length used for intramuscular injections should not be less than one inch in length or more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches long (20-22 gauge).

A volume medication of 2mL per injection or less is usually administered at one site to an adult.

- 1. Wash Hands
- 2. Check Expiration of medication
- 3. Draw up medication and place correct needle size on syringe
- 4. Select site, upper outer quadrant of buttocks OR lateral thigh
- 5. Clean site
- 6. Holding the syringe at a 90 degree angle, plunge the needle firmly and quickly into the muscle to the depth of the needle with steady straightforward motion.
- 7. Aspirate syringe- move the free hand to the plunger of syringe, pull back plunger until slight resistance is felt. <u>If blood appears in syringe, do NOT administer the medication.</u> Withdraw needle and chose different site.
- 8. If no blood appears in syringe with aspiration, inject the medication slowly
- 9. Withdraw needle, massage injection site
